

To the generous donors who made our spring break trip to Memphis possible,

God did a powerful and transformative work through the team of students who made the trip to Memphis, TN, this spring break. Your funds and prayers went further than you may ever realize. They helped make the homes of four familes safer, warmer and drier while simultaneously training a team of college students in cross-cultural ministry.

Illini Life has a long history of ambitious Spring Break missions work. In January, we put bold invitation before our students:

- 1. Give up your spring break.
- 2. Join a team that needs to raise \$13,500 in 7 weeks.
- 3. Let God stretch your faith as you are immersed in the challenging issues of urban poverty, racial reconciliation, and the mission of the Church.

Thirty-nine I-Lifers responded to that call and spent their week serving in the neighborhood of Orange Mound in Memphis. We repaired four roofs and spent many hours giving care and empowerment to homeowners in the name of Jesus Christ. The work was both physically and spiritually demanding. Here are just a few highlights:

- ~ Just 3 days before the trip, we were still \$2,500 short of our fundraising goal. But our team worked hard and God is faithful. At 9 p.m. the night before our departure, we tallied up the gifts and learned that we had exceeded our fundraising goal of \$13,500 by \$150. Amazing! But God wasn't done -- in total, the team raised \$15,046. Any additional funds raised for the trip are directed toward future Illini Life missions work.
- ~ Students heard challenging messages through chapel and daily devotions. They had a night of "exposure visits" with professionals and families who have chosen to live in the inner city to be missional neighbors with the poor. They engaged in spiritual conversations with men and women trapped in drug addiction, prostitution, physical and mental illness, and generational cycles of poverty.
- ~ An international student from Korea, who participated in the missions trip, became a follower of Christ!

This newsletter is an attempt to capture a few memories and lessons learned from our time in Memphis. May it serve as an expression of our appreciation for your partnership in this gospel work!
